PROCEEDINGS OF THE ALPINE CLUB.

A GENERAL MEETING of the Club was held in the Hall, 23 Savile Row, London, W.1, on Tuesday, May 3, 1932, at 8.30 P.M., Sir John J. Withers, *President*, in the Chair.

The following candidates were balloted for and elected members of the Club, namely, Messrs. Paul H. B. Chevalier and Marcus R. C. Overton.

The Regulations for the Winter Dinner were unanimously adopted.

The President announced that Mr. Arthur P. Harper, President of the New Zealand Alpine Club and an ordinary member of the A.C. since 1892, has been elected an Honorary Member of the Alpine Club.

The President proposed that the cordial congratulations of the Club be offered

To Mr. H. G. Watkins, who has received the Founder's Medal of the Royal Geographical Society for his work in the Arctic Regions, especially as leader of the British Arctic Air Route Expedition;

To H.R.H. The Duke of Spoleto (Honorary Member A.C.), awarded the Patron's Medal of the Royal Geographical Society for his work in the Himalaya as leader of the Karakoram Expedition of 1929; and

To Professor A. P. Coleman, F.R.S., of Toronto (Honorary Member A.C.), awarded the Victoria Medal of the Royal Geographical Society for his contribution to the geography and geology of Canada.

This proposal was carried with acclamation.

Mr. H. G. Watkins then read a Paper entitled 'The British Arctic Air Route Expedition,' which was illustrated by lantern slides.

Messrs. T. G. Longstaff, E. H. F. Bradby, L. S. Amery and R. S. Morrish took part in the ensuing discussion, and the proceedings concluded with the passing of a cordial vote of thanks to Mr. H. G. Watkins, proposed by the President.
