## PROCEEDINGS OF THE ALPINE CLUB

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the Club was held in the Hall, 74 South Audley Street, London, W. 1, on Tuesday, December 9, 1941, at 3 P.M., Mr. G. Winthrop Young, *President*, in the Chair.

As provided by Rule 29, there being no other candidates, the *PRESIDENT* declared the following elections and re-elections as Officers and Elective Members of Committee for the year 1942 :

*Vice-President* : Dr. J. H. Clapham, C.B.E., in the place of Mr. R. L. G. Irving, whose term of office expires.

*Elective Members of Committee* : Mr. Bentley Beetham, Dr. N. S. Finzi, Lieut. C. W. F. Noyce, K.R.R.C., and Dr. E. H. Stevens, in the places of Mr. G. L. Bartrum, Mr. Peter Lloyd, Capt. A. D. Malcolm and Mr. J. E. Montgomery, whose terms of office expire.

Secretary and Treasurer*, and the other eligible Elective Members of Committee, namely, Professor G. I. Finch, M.B.E., D.Sc., F.R.S., Dr. Charles F. Hadfield, Mr. Cecil A. Hunt, R.W.S., Flight-Lieut. Lord D. Douglas-Hamilton, R.A.F.V.R., and Mr. G. R. Speaker.

Messrs. Walter Sedgwick and T. A. Rumbold were appointed Auditors to audit the Club Accounts for the current year.

Members were informed that at their meeting on October 7 the Committee had elected Mr. J. R. Fearon and Dr. Raymond E. Priestley members of the Club, and had re-elected Capt. E. A. M. Wedderburn, a former member.

The PRESIDENT referred to the deaths of the following members : H. E. B. Harrison, elected 1890, an original member of the Climbers' Club ; Louis Sussdorf, jun., American Consul-General in Antwerp, elected 1934 ; Lawrence Pilkington, elected 1878 ; A. H. Worthington, elected 1894 ; and O. K. Williamson, elected 1895.

Professor T. Graham Brown then gave a talk on his ascent of the Nordend, Monte Rosa, illustrated by his very fine collection of slides.

The PRESIDENT expressed the appreciation of members.
